Work Sponsorships

The Work Sponsorship Program

- increases students' hourly wages
- gives sponsors an opportunity to encourage and support students

Students are encouraged to recruit sponsors. Sponsors may choose to contribute one of two ways:

- a flat dollar amount each month
- an amount per hour worked

Sponsors will be sent a statement each month with the number of hours the student worked for the previous month and the dollar amount the sponsor should submit.

Work Opportunities

—Industry—

Some positions require students to be 16 years of age and older. It may also require them to have schedules that will allow them to work a four-hour block of time during one of the shifts. Student starting pay, at an industry, is Oregon minimum wage.

—Campus—

Campus Employment opportunities for 14 years of age and older vary from cafeteria, dormitory resident assistants, phone monitors, maintenance, grounds, readers, and office jobs. Pay rates start at \$5.87/hour and offer excellent work experience.

Summer Work

Students who have been accepted for the ensuing school year may be considered for summer job opportunities in

Dormitory students working on campus for ten weeks of the summer should be able to earn a good portion of their initial payment of \$1,860.

Remote Church Discount

Assistance of \$500 is given twice a year to a student meeting the following criteria:

Student's Age

1. To be eligible for assistance for the first term, the student must be less than 16 years of age by Sept. 15.
2. To be eligible for assistance for the second term, the student must be less than 16 years of age by Feb. 1.

Student's Membership

1. A student must be from a remote church as listed by the North Pacific Union Conference. A remote church is one located at least 25 miles from the nearest junior/senior academy.
2. A student attending from areas that have a ninth grade intermediate program is eligible for assistance if all criteria is met.
3. Eligibility is determined by the distance from the student's church to the school, not the family's residence.
4. A student enrolled in an academy across conference lines is still eligible for this assistance. However, no student from outside the North Pacific Union Conference is eligible.
